I WELCOME TO THE QUARTER-FINALS

THE LAST STOP ON THE ROAD TO HAMBURG

With the quarter-finals coming up, the EHF European League Men is only one step away from the final destination of its 2023/24 season. Eight teams are still on board, but only four of them will be able to complete their journey at the EHF Finals Men 2024 at the Barclays Arena in Hamburg on 25/26 May.

The current season saw a significant change in the playing format, as the number of participants (after qualification) was raised from 24 to 32. Following the group matches, the main round, and the play-offs, the competition is now down to the quarter-finals – just like in previous seasons. With four spots at the EHF Finals at stake, the quarter-finals on 23 and 30 April will provide handball fans across the globe with two more Tuesday nights full of thrilling action. Who will book their ticket to Hamburg?

EIGHT TEAMS PLAY FOR FOUR EHF FINALS BERTHS

Germany, the host nation of the EHF Finals, lost one contender in the play-offs but is still represented by no less than three teams – and they are avoiding each other in the quarter-finals.

Defending champions Füchse Berlin were forced to go through the play-off round and now have a mouth-watering matchup in prospect against French side HBC Nantes, who advanced directly from the main round. Former EHF Champions League winners SG Flensburg-Handewitt take on IK Sävehof, the team from Sweden that eliminated TSV Hannover-Burgdorf in the previous phase. And Rhein-Neckar Löwen, who hosted the inaugural EHF Finals three years ago, hope to return to the season-ending highlight as they face strong opposition from Portuguese side Sporting CP.

The only quarter-final with no German participation features two recent EHF Champions League contenders, as Dinamo Bucuresti from Romania aim for their first EHF Finals berth when they cross swords with the last team standing from Denmark, Skjern Håndbold.

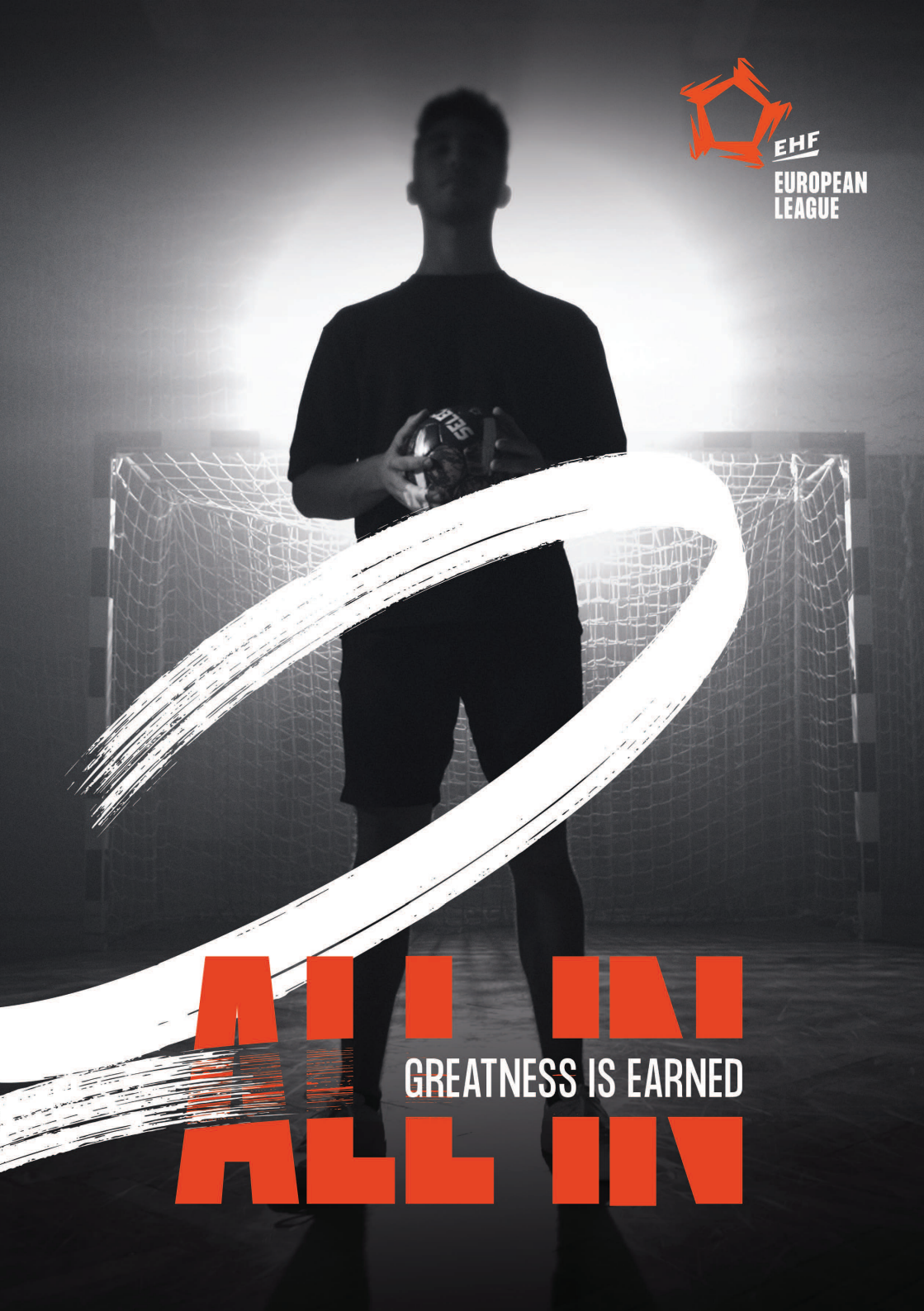

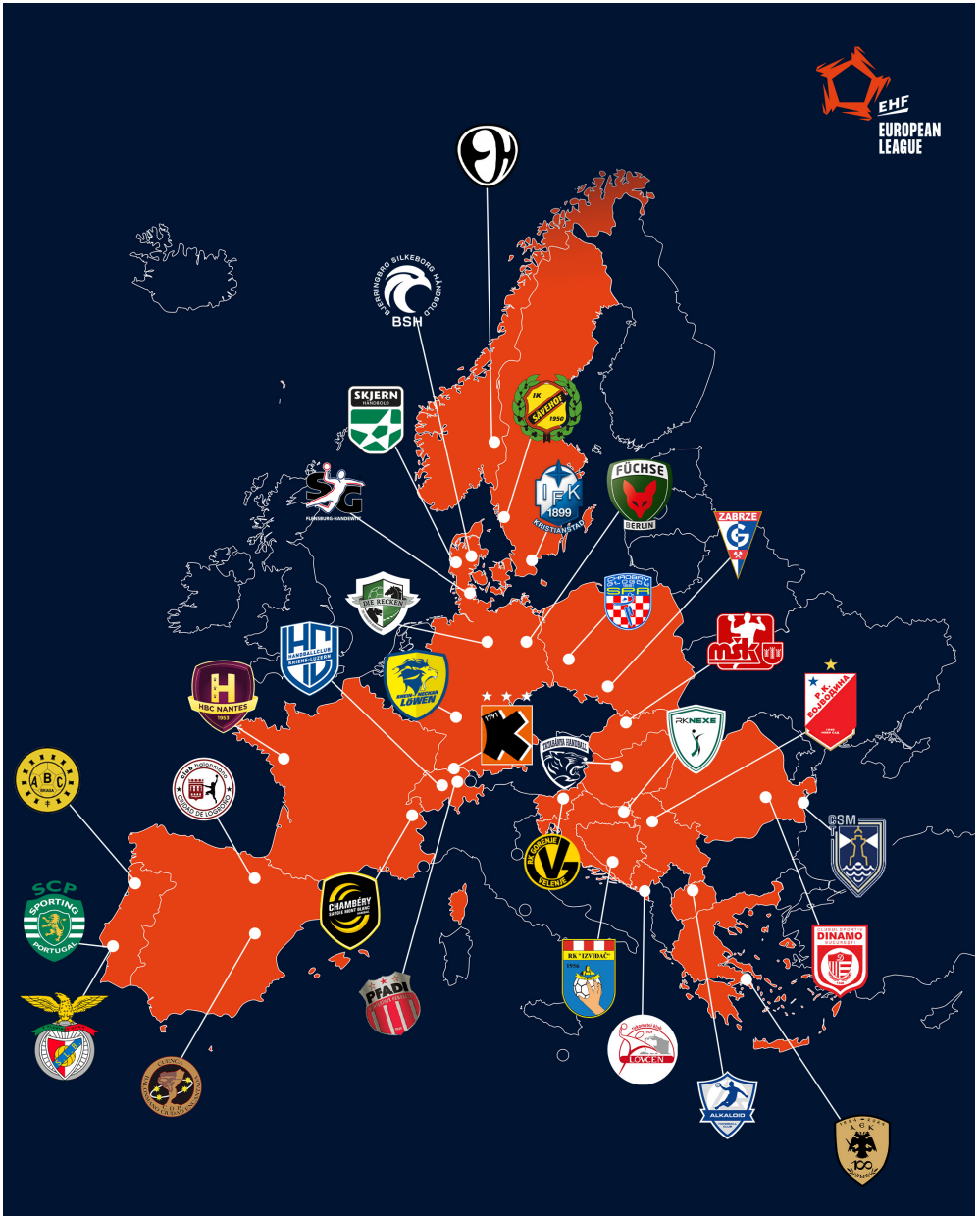

FACTS & FIGURES: IMPORTANT NUMBERS BEFORE THE QUARTER-FINALS

After the thrilling play-offs, the EHF European League Men is ready for the quarter-finals as the eight remaining teams face the last step on the road to the EHF Finals Men 2024 at the Barclays Arena in Hamburg on 25/26 May.

Here are interesting facts & figures before the quarter-finals throw off:

0 national derbies take place in the quarter-finals, even though three teams from the same country (Germany) are involved.

0 play-off matches ended in a draw.

1 quarter-final pairing has also been a knock-out tie in a previous EL season: HBC Nantes and Füchse Berlin met in the 2021/22 play-offs, with the French side advancing to the quarter-finals.

1

former EHF Champions League winner is part of the quarter-finals: SG Flensburg-Handewitt (2014).

1 of the three German teams in the play-offs failed to make the quarter-finals: TSV Hannover-Burgdorf lost against IK Sävehof.

1 participant of the EHF Finals 2023 is still part of the competition this season: defending champions Füchse Berlin; runners-up Fraikin BM. Granollers lost in qualification, Frisch Auf Göppingen are not playing in Europe, and Montpellier HB are back in the Machineseeker EHF Champions League.

1 quarter-finalist started their EL season in the qualification round: Rhein-Neckar Löwen.

1 play-off match featured more than 70 goals, when Dinamo Bucuresti defeated Bjerringbro-Silkeborg 37:34.

2 quarter-finalists played in the CL last season: Dinamo and Nantes.

2 goals was the smallest winning margin in a play-off match, when Löwen beat RK Nexse 31:29.

2 play-off matches were attended by more than 3,000 spectators – both legs of Kadetten Schaffhausen vs Füchse: 3,500 fans were in the BBC Arena; 4,717 in the Max-Schmeling-Halle.

3 teams won both legs in the play-offs: Dinamo, Füchse, and Löwen.

3

quarter-finalists also played in the EL quarter-finals last season: Flensburg, Füchse, and Sporting.

4 teams that won their respective group in the main round skipped the play-offs and advanced to the quarter-finals directly: Nantes, Skjern Håndbold, Flensburg, and Sporting.

4 quarter-finalists have played at the EHF FINAL4 in the past: Nantes, Flensburg, Berlin and Löwen.

4 times in the eight play-off matches, fans saw 60 or more goals; 73 matches since the start of the group matches had 60 or more goals.

5 goals was the smallest aggregate margin in the play-offs, when Sävehof beat Hannover 64:59.

6

quarter-finalists have won a European trophy in the past: Skjern, Sävehof, Flensburg, Füchse, Löwen, and Sporting.

6 nations are represented in the quarter-finals: Germany (with three teams), Denmark, France, Portugal, Romania, and Sweden (with one team each); 19 nations were represented by the 32 teams when the competition started with the group matches last October.

9 goals was the biggest winning margin in a play-off match, when Sävehof beat Hannover 34:25.

9 different teams have played at the three EHF Finals events so far since the 2020/21 season.

19

goals made Sävehof's Gustaf Wedberg the best scorer in the play-offs.

43 was the lowest number of goals in a play-off match, when Löwen won 24:19 at RK Nexø.

52 goals was the most by a team in an EL match this season, when Dinamo beat Izvidac 52:24.

71 was the highest number of goals in a play-off match, when Dinamo beat Bjerringbro 37:34; the best mark for the EL season so far is 78 goals, when Flensburg beat Schaffhausen 46:32.

77 goals make Dinamo's Andrii Akimenko the EL top scorer since the start of the group matches.

470 goals in total were scored in the four play-offs ties: 123 at Hannover vs Sävehof; 122 at both Dinamo vs Bjerringbro and Kadetten vs Füchse; and 103 at Nexø vs Löwen.

10,017 fans in the XXL Arena for Nantes vs Löwen in the group matches is the highest attendance figure for an EL match so far this season.

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN BOTH TEAMS HAVE THE SAME NUMBER OF POINTS?

All matches shall be played in accordance with the IHF's current Rules of the Game. Variations on a technical level are possible. All matches of the EHF European League shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes with a half-time break of 15 minutes.

The matches shall be scored as follows:

- a) win = 2 points
- b) draw = 1 point
- c) loss = 0 points

Teams' rankings are obtained by adding up the number of points won.

PLAY-OFFS AND QUARTER-FINALS

If, after completion of the two matches, both clubs have won the same number of points (no extra time will be played), the teams' standings shall be determined by the following criteria:

- a) goal difference
- b) penalty throws

RULES FOR EXECUTION OF PENALTY THROWS

- Only players (incl. goalkeepers) who are listed on the match report and are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate at the penalty throws.
- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five players by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.
- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the Game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.
- The referees shall choose the goal at which throws are taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again, five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).
- In the second round, a decision (a winner) is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.
- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

DINAMO BUCURESTI VS SKJERN HÅNDBOLD

- Dinamo Bucuresti face Danish opposition for the second straight time, after they defeated Bjerringbro-Silkeborg twice in the play-offs: 37:34 and 27:24.
- The Romanian side have lost against only two teams this season, but did so both home and away – against Füchse Berlin in the group matches, and against Sporting CP in the main round.
- Along those four defeats, Dinamo won their other eight matches.
- Dinamo are in their first European quarter-final in 16 years; in 2007/08, they went on to reach the semi-finals of the Challenge Cup.
- Andrii Akimenko scored 12 times for Dinamo in the play-offs as the Ukrainian right wing raised his total for the season to a competition-leading 77.
- With 129 saves, Vladimir Cupara is third in the goalkeeper standings.
- Dinamo hold the record for most goals scored in a match this season: 52 in the group match against Izvidac (52:24).
- Skjern Håndbold finished runners-up to RK Nexø in the group matches before winning their main round group, ahead of IK Sävehof, to skip the play-offs.
- The Danish side have seven wins from their 10 matches so far this season.
- Skjern return to the quarter-finals of a European competition for the first time in six years; in 2017/18, they reached this stage in the EHF Champions League.
- The group phase of that same season marked the last time Skjern and Dinamo met, with the Danish side clearly winning both duels: 39:28 and 36:23.
- Last season, Skjern missed the EL quarter-finals following a Last 16 defeat against Füchse Berlin, who then went on to win the title.
- Contrary to opponents Dinamo, the Danish outfit have won European trophies in the past: Skjern took the Challenge Cup twice more than two decades ago.
- Skjern top scorer Viktor Bergtholm has netted 57 times so far.

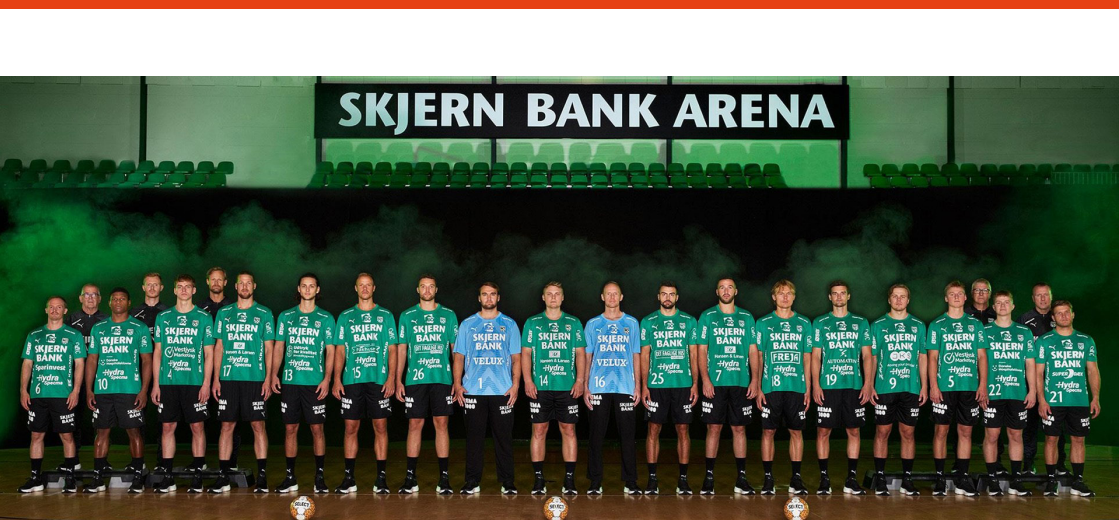

- IK Sävehof were the only team to advance from the play-offs after losing the first leg; they lost 34:30 at TSV Hannover-Burgdorf before beating the German side 34:25 at home.
- The Swedish side were undefeated in the group matches, but nearly went out in the main round as only a second-half comeback at RK Nexø saw them advance.
- Sävehof have not been at this stage of a second-tier European club competition before; their biggest triumph is their Challenge Cup win 10 years ago.
- Gustaf Wedberg scored 12 and seven goals, respectively, in the two play-off legs against Hannover as the right wing raised his tally for the season to 71.
- Sävehof have an all-Nordic squad, and apart from a Faroese, an Icelandic, and a Norwegian player, even an all-Swedish squad.
- With an average age of just 22.2 years, Sävehof have by far the youngest squad of the eight quarter-finalists.
- SG Flensburg-Handewitt eased through the main round, winning all four matches by a margin of 10 or more goals.
- Their only defeat this season remains the 25:24 loss at Kadetten Schaffhausen in the group matches.
- The German side have scored 379 goals in their 10 matches so far; four times, they scored over 40 goals, led by the 45:26 against Bjerringbro-Silkeborg.
- Flensburg are the only club in Europe that have won four different EHF trophies: EHF Cup, City Cup, Cup Winners' Cup, and EHF Champions League.
- Last season, Flensburg hosted the EHF Finals but missed out on their home tournament after a surprise loss to Fraikin BM. Granollers in the quarter-finals.
- Flensburg have one Swedish player in their squad: Jim Gottfridsson; sports director Ljubomir Vranjes, who was Flensburg's coach when they won the EHF Champions League in 2014, was born in Sweden.

- Füchse Berlin advanced from the play-offs with two wins against Kadetten Schaffhausen: 32:28 and 34:28.
- The titleholders had missed out on direct qualification for the quarter-finals after two defeats against Sporting CP in the main round.
- Earlier, Füchse had a perfect start to their title defence as the only team that won all six group matches.
- The German side aim for their eighth appearance at the final tournament of Europe's second-tier club competition; they won the EHF Cup Finals in 2015 and 2018, and the EHF Finals in 2023.
- Mathias Gisdal was named IHF Player of the Year 2023 in March; the Füchse right back was the top scorer of the Men's EHF EURO 2024 in January, and the top scorer and MVP of the 2023 IHF Men's World Championship.
- Hans Lindberg could lift his fourth trophy in 11 seasons, having won the EHF Champions League (2013) with HSV, and the EHF Cup (2018) and EHF European League (2023) with Füchse.
- HBC Nantes eased through the main round with four clear victories to win group I ahead of Rhein-Neckar Löwen, earning them a direct quarter-final spot.
- Nantes also played Füchse in the 2021/22 knockout phase: they won that Last 16 pairing before losing in the quarter-finals to another opponent from Germany: SC Magdeburg.
- Füchse are already the third German opponents for Nantes this season, after the French side met Löwen in the group matches and TSV Hannover-Burgdorf in the main round.
- Nantes are one of just two quarter-finalists who have not won a European trophy yet (Dinamo Bucuresti are the others); however, they played the final of the EHF Cup in 2013 and 2016, and of the EHF Champions League in 2018.
- Last season, Nantes reached the knockout phase of the EHF Champions League, where they lost to OrLEN Wisla Plock after a shoot-out in the play-offs.
- Nantes' best scorer so far is Valero Rivera with 53 goals.

- Rhein-Neckar Löwen are the only quarter-finalists who started their season in the qualification round.
- In the play-offs, the German side defeated RK Nexø twice; earlier, they finished second in the group matches and second in the main round, with their only two defeats coming against HBC Nantes and Górnik Zabrze.
- Löwen are the only club with two players in the top six of the top scorers list: Niclas Kirkeløkke and Juri Knorr.
- David Späth, junior world champion with Germany in 2023, is among the best goalkeepers of the season regarding the save rate, with a percentage of 37.55.
- Löwen hosted the inaugural EHF Finals in 2021, but were kept out of the final by current titleholders Füchse Berlin and finished the event in third place.
- In 2021/22, Löwen lost to Sporting's domestic rivals Sport Lisboa e Benfica in qualification, but they have not met Sporting in an official match before.
- Sporting CP impressed in the main round with two wins over defending champions Füchse Berlin within eight days on their way to winning group IV.
- The Portuguese side's only defeats this season happened in the group matches – against CSM Constanta and MOL Tatabánya KC.
- Just like quarter-final opponents Löwen, Sporting have not dropped a point yet in their home matches this season.
- Sporting play for their first EHF Finals berth, after they lost in the knockout phase by a single goal on aggregate in each of the last three seasons: in the 2020/21 Last 16 against Orlen Wisła Płock, in the 2021/22 Last 16 against SC Magdeburg, and in the 2022/23 quarter-finals against Montpellier HB.
- Sporting's biggest European success so far is winning the Challenge Cup twice.
- Costa brothers Francisco (53) and Martim (52) are the two leading scorers for Sporting this season.
